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2025 SEASON JUNIOR COMPETITIONS INFORMATION LETTER

Welcome to Noosa Netball for the 2025 Junior Mixed competition - ages 8-18 years. In this pack you will find some useful information. We are looking forward to a great season and are happy you have chosen Noosa Netball for your netball experience this year.

Noosa Netball will also run a 2nd junior competition commencing on Wednesday, 8th August. This is the Twilight Competition under lights at the McKinnon Drive Courts for players 8 – 18 years. A modified division will also be offered

REGISTRATION:

Membership fees must be paid via Netball Connect by the due dates listed on the calendar.

All coaches, umpires, managers and club personnel that are not already registered as a player must be registered on NetballConnect, under the appropriate category

SCORING:

Scoring is electronically via NetballConnect (Live Scoring). Each team must supply a scorer and they must stand together to confirm and agree upon the score.

Live Scoring – Clubs will be provided with a “how to score” information sheet.

- Each team must nominate two (2) scorers for the season to enable set up in NetballConnect.
- The Home team (the team listed first on the draw) will be the scoring team.

In the unlikely event that live scoring is unavailable, paper score sheets can be obtained from the clubhouse. These must be returned to the clubhouse at the end of the game.

- Ensure that every player who is taking the court sign the scoresheet with their usual signature. This is the record we use to ascertain a player’s eligibility to play in the finals series.

ROLLING SUBS

Rolling Substitutions are allowed for Divisions 1-3 only.

NEW PLAYERS

Should you have new players register during the season, ensure they have registered online via [Netball Connect](#) prior to taking the court. There are penalties for playing an unregistered player.

UNIFORMS

Players must be in FULL Uniform at all times however:

- Teams are permitted four (4) calendar weeks from Week 1 to be in full uniform.

- Players registering during the season are permitted four (4) calendar weeks from date of their registration to be in full uniform.

FINALS ELIGIBILITY

- Players must play a minimum of three (3) competition games for their Team/Club to qualify for finals games.

MALE PLAYERS PER TEAM

Male players are able to play in the Junior Mixed Competition. A maximum of 3 male players are permitted to play in any single team. The age limit for males is 14 (turning 14 in 2025)

Male players must be in three different positions on court (Defending, Centre Positions and Attacking positions):

1. Goal Keeper or Goal Defence (Defending Positions)
2. Wing Attack, Wing Defence or Centre (Centre Positions)
3. Goal Attack or Goal Shooter (Attacking Positions)

Scratch Matches	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the case of a team who advised their intention to forfeit a game for a specific round and the game is subsequently postponed due to wet weather, then the notice of intention to forfeit will no longer be valid. Such teams will be eligible to play in the rescheduled match. Teams are encouraged to play a scratch match in the event of a forfeit. If a scratch match is played, then the team that has forfeited receives no points nor will they be credited with any goals scored. The forfeit fine is waived in this instance.

DUTIES:

There are some duties that we ask our clubs to assist with during the season:

❖ CANTEEN DUTY

Each week teams will be rostered on for this duty for one hour and requires one volunteer from each team. Clubs will be provided further details on times and dates closer to the competition start

Each volunteer must be aged 14 or over.

❖ UMPIRING

Each team may be required to nominate a suitable umpire for their team for the season. We will be running our Umpiring Development Program with the majority of our umpires expected to be sourced from this program, however, depending on the draw and the number of available umpires, there may be occasions where a team umpire will be required.

❖ GROUNDS DUTY

Each week a team is rostered on for grounds duty. Grounds duty is either 'set up' or 'pack up'.

- **Set Up 7:45am** – Putting up goal post and light post protectors, put bins and signage out and assist with anything else that the committee may need help with for set up.
- **Pack Up – after last game has concluded** - take down all goal post protectors and post padding and return to equipment shed, pick up any litter left around the courts and place all rubbish bins at the front of the canteen. Return any signage to the shed
